Call for Paper Proposals

The 58th Annual Meeting of the Comparative and International Education Society will be held in Toronto, March 10-15, 2014.

The Globalization and Education SIG will be hosting a number of panel sessions, as well as the Globalization and Education SIG Invited Lecture. The SIG also offers a prize for the best paper by an early career researcher (a student or a scholar who has received his or her doctorate within the past 5 years).

The SIG invites papers that engage with questions related to globalization and education broadly considered. We are particularly interested in papers that engage with the methodological issues that emerge in researching globalization, as well as submissions related to theoretical developments in globalization research. Additional topics of interest include globalization and higher education; how to theorize diffusion and translation; globalization and its impact on the method of comparison as well as on the politics of comparison; issues connected with scale and spatial reach; global educational governance; education and global social justice; and, global aid trends and education. The SIG also welcomes papers and presentations that deal with teaching about globalization and education.

Submission Guidelines for Individual Papers

Proposals for an individual presentation should be 500-750 words in length and should include the following information even if the results, findings and/or conclusions are still preliminary at the time of the submission:

1. Objectives or purposes of the paper
2. Main perspective or theoretical/conceptual framework utilized
3. Analytical methods, research design, or modes of inquiry
4. Data sources or evidence
5. Results and/or conclusions
6. Significance of the study to the field of comparative or international education.

Submission Guidelines for Panel Papers

Proposals for group panel presentations should include an overall description of the panel of between 500-750 words and include the following information:

1. Title of the panel session
2. Objectives and main questions to be addressed in the panel session
3. Main perspectives and/or theoretical/conceptual frameworks
4. Importance of the panel session to comparative/international education or to the conference theme
5. Description of how the session will be structured

Each individual presentation within the Panel should include a 200-250 word summary of the following:

1. Objectives or purposes of the paper
2. Perspective or theoretical/conceptual framework
3. Analytical methods, research design, or modes of inquiry
4. Data sources or evidence
5. Main results and/or conclusions
6. Significance of the presentation to the overall panel topic

Finally, the proposal should include a list of the panel members including their institutional affiliations and contact information.

Deadlines

The early bird deadline is October 4th, 2012. The final deadline for all submitted proposals is October 25, 2012. Proposals should be electronically submitted through the CIES on-line submission system, and comply with the requirements detailed in the guidelines below. Proposals that do not comply with these requirements will not be considered for inclusion in the program.

Paper and panel proposals not accepted for presentation by the SIG will be forwarded to the General Pool for consideration by the Conference Organizers.
